Animal experiments are cruel and also proven to fail human patients

- The latest Home Office figures show that 2.88 million experiments were conducted on sentient animals in the UK, in 2020.
- A total of 4,270 experiments were conducted on Beagles (a significant increase in number compared to the figure of 4,055 in 2019). Out of the total number of experiments on dogs, the majority (68%) were to fulfil regulatory requirements, as falsely claimed 'predictive models of humans'
- Experiments on dogs typically involve being force-fed chemicals directly into their stomachs, every day for up to 90 days, with no pain relief or anaesthetic. These experiments produce vomiting, diarrhoea, internal bleeding, organ damage, seizures, paralysis and even death. All the dogs are killed at the end of the experiments.
- Cage confinement drives animals insane. Prior to being killed, many are deliberately injured including by surgery, chemicals, genetic manipulation and disease infection.

- Medical experts in the wider scientific community, outside the vested interests of animal-based research, agree that such animal experiments entirely fail to predict the responses of human patients, and are now proven to prevent the arrival of human treatments and cures.
- The FDA says 9 out of 10 new medicines fail human/clinical trials after animal tests.
- The National Cancer Institute says we have lost cures for cancer because studies in rodents have been believed
- The Editor in Chief of the British Medical Journal, together with pharmaceutical companies, openly acknowledge the failure of such animal experiments for human patients.
- · Funding urgently needs to be redirected towards advanced human-based methods, which are available now and have a track record of success, producing data which is directly applicable to humans.
